to "open windows" and leave their comfort zone as a way of personal growth.

Addressing the challenges that arise in their personal or professional life will make

them develop and learn new skills; By overcoming these challenges, they will also

overcome their fears and become more trained and happier people.

The backbone of our educational project is innovation, languages and the personal

growth of each student. In 2015 our Center began its international journey with

participation in European and transoceanic cooperation projects.

Achieve that the academic development of our students reaches educational

excellence, taking into account the diversity of each one of them, in a climate of

coexistence, work and demand coordinated by the teaching team, it is our yearly

challenge.

1. Context and Background

Within the international relations of our center we have the ERASMUS + program,

dependent on the European Union (EU) through the national agency Spanish Service

for the Internationalization of Education (SEPIE). This program allows us to mobilize

Vocational Training students to carry out internships and teachers to develop training

activities in companies in other countries at an international level.

The participation in the Erasmus + Program aims to improve the quality of Vocational

Training teaching by contributing to the complete growth of our students through the

development of professional, linguistic, personal and social skills.

With this international experience we want to contribute to break down geographical,

cultural and linguistic barriers among young people all over the world, improving the

understanding between countries, cultures, races and religions, in addition to the

promotion of the Spanish culture in the world. The students of the Vocational Center

San Ignacio are our ambassadors in the world and through them also other people will

get to know our culture, our values and our lifestyle.

With the European project "Open Windows" we want to "open windows" in our

students, in our Center and in our environment. "Open windows" to open the mind to

new knowledge and new experiences, making easier their future incorporation into

the labor market in a more global world.

After several finished successful projects, our center has been selected as one of the

beneficiaries of the precious Erasmus + KA120 Accreditation; This means, according to

SEPIE itself that "it is like having a membership card for the mobility action of the

program", allowing us to have continuity in the participation of the Erasmus + 2021 -

2027 program.

This accreditation guarantees the quality of the initial and continuous vocational

training in Europe and the contribution to the creation of the European Education Area

based on the following basic principles: Inclusion and diversity; Sustainability and

environmental responsibility; Digital education and active participation in the Erasmus

organizations network.

dropouts, especially of the Basic Level Vocational students.

- Create a responsible and committed culture with initiatives and sustainable

development projects

- Increase the e-competences/ e-skills of the participants to adapt themselves to the

new needs that the work market demands.

- Open Windows V (OW-V). K120 Accreditation: 72 currently requested mobilities.
